

Highlights


- **Participation**: Over 1600 foreign and 700 local participants, 100 remote participants; high participation of governments (20%)
- Hot topics discussed: NETmundial overview and NETmundial Initiative,
 IANA transition and ICANN accountability, net neutrality
- Main developments: Call for extended mandate of IGF, founding of the IGF
 Support Association

Most Frequent Words - IGF through Language Analysis







Selected IG terms



Improvements

- Discussions: controversial topics (net neutrality)
- IGF as a process hub: updates from and discussions about global IG architecture and processes (NETmundial, WSIS+10 and CSTD review, IANA)
- "Tangible outcomes": Best practice forum (child protection, CERT, local content, multistakeholder mechanisms, spam)
- Community inputs: on process and topics
- Capacity building track: Orientation sessions (webinars and in-situ) and CB roundtable
- National and regional IGFs

Focus topics

- Human rights: Almost 50 related workshops; message on privacy for the HR
 Council; initiative for best practice forum on privacy and data protection;
 African Declaration on Internet Rights and Freedoms
- Net neutrality: Several workshops and a main session; emerging concepts technical (CDN) and economic ("Zero-rating", specialised services); basic principles instead of "one size fits all" regulation; human rights as a driver for demand
- Internet access: into the post MDGs
- Building digital trust: dialogue between government and other stakeholders

Coming next

IGF mandate: End 2014

Renewal of MAG: End 2014

- Expected in 2015: New Best practice forums (incl. data protection and privacy), Intersessional dialogue (incl. net neutrality), link to other processes (WSIS+10, NETmundial Initiative, HR Council), other tangible outcomes (principles)
- Wider context: WSIS+10 (2015), CSTD review on 10 years of WSIS (call for contributions), ITU Plenipotentiary (20 October – 7 November, Busan, Korea)
